THE WILD BUNCH CORNER

A wet cool August morning with rain showers all day? Yep, that's what we shot in. Due to the weather Brazos point/school house area was used exclusively and kept all nine of us dry enough and entertained all day.

We started out with a HooDoo Brown designed stage featuring 20 pistol, 10 rifle and 5 shotgun. A well thought out stage with enough movement to make it interesting. Billy Bob was shoot'n his looong barreled shotgun and I think he had to step back to keep from shoot'n pastem. It stopped raining so we stepped over to the school house and shot an all pistol of 25 rounds. Again at the school house Bruce Jarret designed a 15 pistol, 7 rifle and 5 shotgun stage. This was a fast moving 3 position stage. For stage number 4 silver Sam said why not a 40 round stage? Well heck yea but let's just turn it into a super stage! So 2 flipper targets throwing doubles started you out with 6 shotgun rounds to the left of Brazos point. Moving under cover the gunfight began taking out various banks of targets continuing to the far end of BP and engaging 4 more shotgun targets. Retrieving your 1911 advance to the school house to finish the fight. This super stage took 100 seconds raw time for fast shooters and covered nearly 100 feet of movement with 50 rounds total fired! No dump plates, no double taps. How's that for match design? This was a crowd pleaser with Evil Roy and wicked Felina both commenting how much they liked it.

Matter of fact a video that I guess Tripp recorded is on ER's Facebook page with WF shooting this very

stage. Oddly enough our traditional shooters Greased Light'n and Hoodoo had some of the fastest times on this stage. New shooters are always welcome. Want to try Wild Bunch one time? Stroll over we will put a 45 in your hands and shoot a stage with us. Open class with relaxed rules can also get your feet wet. A quick break for a great homemade hamburger (thanks Sidewinder!) then on to BAMB which continues to grow in popularity. 7 of the 9 WB shooters stepped up for BAMB and 2 fun and fast matches were had. First one was 10 rounds from the left table and you started behind the white line rifle on table empty load and fire. Second was 15 rounds from three different tables beginning the same way. Hoodoo won both these exhibiting some really fine shooting. Our newest BAMB convert Triple F was using Greased Light's rifle and was deadly on the targets. If you want to try BAMB just stroll over and one of us will put a rifle in your hand!

WB rule change to allow 7 rounds in magazines takes effect Jan 1, 2018 This is in response to wild bunch competitors asking for more rounds In the mags.

Wild bunch on the Brazos Texas state Championship Nov.4-5 Is getting here really quick and will feature Two BAM matches And side matches. This looks like it's going to be a great match with a lot of top competitors coming in from all areas including Oklahoma, Louisiana, Missouri, New Mexico and Arkansas. Registration is on the CVV website and will be designed as a world class match. Make plans to Attend.

BAKERS GOING WEST

The Bakers were in North and South Carolina. After the War of 1812 opened up the southern states, over half of the people there migrated en-masse to the area around Choctaw Ridge on the Natchez Trace in Mississippi about 1840 or so. Neil and Jane Baker were among them. They are actually listed in a document regarding that migration.

After the Red River War of 1874 made it "safe" for settlers in "North West" Texas, over half of the people up on Choctaw Ridge moved en-masse to Loving's Valley in Texas. My great-granddaddy John Thomas Baker was the youngest of 6 Baker children; he was born in Mississippi in 1860. He walked to Texas with his brother, one of their sisters, and her family when he was 15 years old.

Back around 1987, my dad and I took his Uncle Obed to see the actual Baker Farm where John Thomas Baker was born, up on Choctaw Ridge in Mississippi.

Neil and Jane and about everyone else there were poor subsistence farmers in Mississippi, having had only one or two slaves. After the Civil War, they were suddenly shorthanded and the land was "cropped out". Neil and Jane told the 6 children that half of them would have to go west to find better circumstances and a new start. So 15 year old John Thomas, brother James Monroe "Bud", and sister Martha Ann Baker "Matt" Dalton (she was married) walked to Texas with an Ox Cart along with half the other folks in the area--to Loving's Valley. This seems daunting; there is no doubt. However, the place they were headed was already being populated by

others they knew. The ancestors of those people had all moved together, over a period time in the 1840s, from the Carolinas to Mississippi.

The family of Oliver Loving, not owning the land they occupied, moved on up to Jermyn and bought his Loving Ranch. Others of my family bought what had been part of that ranch.

Grandmother Baker (Timmie Herring) was a Herring, and half of the Herring clan came west in this group from Mississippi to Texas—just as their ancestors had moved from the Carolinas to Mississippi, as well.

All those folks ended up in "North West" Texas. The 3 Bakers never saw their parents or other 3 sisters again. They never even spoke of their 3 sisters, claiming all the records had been burned in a courthouse fire.

The Herrings, after living in the Rippey Cabin and in an old stagecoach station (the location of which is on land now owned by yet another cousin) eventually bought land from the state of Texas near the Rock Creek area of Mineral Wells; here, they built a log cabin. The deed was signed by Gov. Lawrence S. "Sul" Ross; he had been the leader of the Texas Rangers that captured Cynthia Ann Parker back from the Indians—and also a Confederate general. That log cabin stood as the oldest standing log cabin in the county, till the land owner burned it down a few years ago. It made everyone in the community mad. That Herring farm is adjacent to the Rock Creek Baptist Church there today.

The Bakers truly were part of the western movement of "manifest destiny".

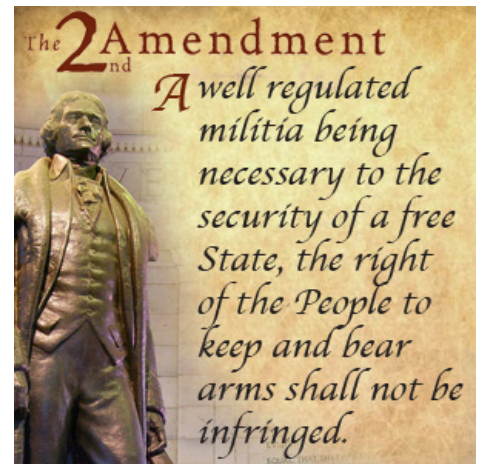
