Late July in Texas is supposed to be hot. What to do? Have a great wild bunch match with lots of shooting! Nine shooters. Four great stages with the first being at the fort where the plate rack was engaged twice and moving to center 3 statics and 4 autosets engaged twice then taking the shotgun and sweeping the 4 autosets. Triple F liked the distance and target placement on this stage. Greased Lightnin bought and brought the 4 new auto reset targets out for us. Thanks GL! The autosets are the most versatile targets found to date being utilized for any gun on the stage, no question of a hit and best of all No down range or hand reset. These are even used for BAMB with great success. Moving over to Brazos Point pistol caliber (pc) Rifle was for 7 targets out to 20 yards, Doughboy (DB) and Rebelde Gringo (RG) was 5 shots out to 65 yards. Drawing the 45 14 targets were engaged moving to center 7 engaged then to the last position where 7 more targets were engaged. Wicked Felina tore this stage up! Could you imagine a robber breaking into wicked Felina and Evil Roy's House? the only argument would be who put how many rounds where (No Roy, I hit him there with my new Ruger PC!) Moving to The shade tree/school house area from 1st position draw and fire on 5 statics and 2 bells moving to center shooting the snuff cans and 2 bells then on to the third position for a mirror image of the first. Goatneck shined on this one and enjoyed course and precision targets all on the same stage. Picking up shotgun alternate 4 rounds on 2 autosets and finishing with the pc rifle with 5 out to 30 yards or dB/RG rifles out to 65 yards for 5. With 3 stages under the belt a

quick survey revealed a knockdown drag out bare knuckled all pistol stage was needed. Targets combined from Brazos Point to the shade tree gave the shooters 42 targets in banks of seven spread over about 80' with no double taps and targets of all sizes, shapes and distances. Watauga kid liked this stage so much he wanted to shoot even more! This was an absolute blast as was the whole day but this wasn't a special match, this was a typical wild bunch match. It's just always this good! A good lunch and a little rest goes a long way. Shady McLarry read us match results and then we went back for some more shooting. Volunteers were needed to test out a fund raiser for the sass scholarship. What started out as a test turned into a full blown competition. Autoset targets placed at 10-15-25-35-45-55 yards with 45 autos the first time shooters were given 6 shots at the six plates and a Talley was kept for each. Second time the shooters were all lined up and stepped into a designated spot and shot one certain target and if missed withdrew from the line if hit stayed in the line to continue on at further targets with the pool of shooters getting smaller until a winner prevailed which was hoodoo who laid the target down at 55 yards. Offhand. 1911. 6" target. This fund raiser looks to be a winner it will be tweaked a little more but it's a great concept. Goatneck said imagine that with BAMB rifles.....yes! And speaking of BAMB it had finally warmed up enough that we broke out the BAMB rifles and shot a sniper that consisted of a 10" target at around 120 and four other targets ranging in to 85 yards with a sweep for 10 shots. Second BAMB being combat 4 generous plates at around 65 to 85 yards consisted of 10 shots in a continuous Nevada sweep. Evil Roy brought out one of the new ruger pc carbines in 9 mm it takes Glock mags, shoots great, breaks in half, reliable and it's a winner. GL

had a jg on an ar platform rigged out. Hoodoo had a 24-3 with a handful of shells for everyone to shoot and enjoy. Billy Bob was shooting a Yugo 24 converted to 45acp in open class and he did quite well with it. He had no trouble hitting the BAMB combat targets with that fun little rifle.

Skirmish at Mills Creek the state wild bunch championship is shaping up nicely. Featuring 10 stage main match, BAMB, a slew of great and fun side matches including a really cool fund raiser for the sass scholarship fund. Get your application in now! 3 great days of shooting with Friday being all side match and BAMB. This promises to be the best one yet.

Read the Wild Bunch rule book and don't worry about all the right gear, Any 1911, Any pump shotgun and Any sass legal main match rifle gets you shooting in open class. Use your S.A.A. Rebelde Gringo class allows a rifle caliber lever action so dust off the 30-30 or 45-70 for fun and doughboy is proving to be a blast shooting the BAMB rifles in the main match.

YOU SHOOT TODAY IT KILLS TOMORROW Pt 2

In 1873, the buffalo kill off of the central herd in the Kansas Nebraska area was coming to an end. Only a few small numbers were left, and they were difficult to find. J. Wright Mocar would become the most prolific buffalo shooter in the massive buffalo hunting days. He decided to venture into the Texas Panhandle to determine if any large herds were there. He found herds in the millions of animals, bigger than what he had ever seen in Kansas.

He returned to Dodge with his report. Many were leery about going into the Texas Panhandle, so Mocar and a couple of other hunters went the 6 miles over to Ft. Dodge and talked to Major G.M. Dodge. They asked him what he thought the government's reaction would be to them entering the Texas Panhandle to hunt buffalo. Major Dodge replied, "Boys, if I were buffalo hunters, I would hunt buffalo where the buffalo are".

As a result, Charley Myers and Charles Rath (competitors in the hide business) both went down into Texas to the Canadian River and established a post they called Adobe Walls. There they each established "stores" to do business with the hunters. Along with them came James Hanrahan. He brought a stock of whiskey and opened a saloon between the two stores owned by Rath and Myers.

J. Wright Mocar and his hunting "camp" group went off a few miles from the new post to hunt. They had 6 men, 3 mule teams and wagons, and 3 saddle horses. At their camp, a

small group of Indians came but passed on by. Early the next morning while it was still almost dark, a larger bunch of Indians attacked the camp. They were riding and lying on the sides of their horses, while shooting from under the bellies of the horse. In the first charge attack, expert marksman hunter John Hughes leveled his Sharps Big .50; he shot through the lead horse—and through the rider as well. The savages took cover a ways off but kept shooting. They inflicted no damage, since they were out of range for their weapons to be effective.

Such was not the case for the hunters. In the near darkness, the hunters could see the flash of the Indians rifles as they fired. The shooters would then shoot their Sharps at the flash and could easily hit the Indians. At this point in history, the buffalo hunters were the best marksmen on Earth; their Sharps rifles were the best firearms the world had ever known. The results proved deadly for the outgunned savages. They were easy targets. The savages gave up the fight and left. Mocar hunted there 10 days; his group collected 666 buffalo hides and meat, which they intended to take to Adobe Walls. Their camp was 2 days away from the post.

Word was spreading that the savages were leaving the reservation to go out and kill the hunters, both in remote hunting camps as well as those at the Adobe Walls post. Back at the post, 5 soldiers from Camp Supply arrived with guide scout Amos Chatman. He came with a message for only Charley Myers, Charles Rath, and Jim Hanrahan. The message was that a massive number of Indians were fixin' to attack the post on a certain day, at a certain time. Amos wound up revealing the message to John Mocar as well, while camping in his wagon. The secret was not revealed to the hunters for fear that

they would leave and return to Dodge, thus leaving the post without any protection at all.

John Mocar decided to go warn his brother J. Wright Mocar, camped on the Red River. The Wrights moved their camp back to Adobe Walls. Despite 2 days in a hard push with massive rains and Indian attacks all of the way, they made a run for it. They had the help of 48 yolks of oxen (96 animals) from the fort to get them and their wagons across the flooding Canadian River, all the while fighting the Indians. Again, the Big .50 Sharps rifles controlled and won the skirmishes as they arrived safely. Other hunting camps were arriving at the post as well; each reported that Indians had killed one or two of their group. At Adobe Walls, they decided to take the hides on to Dodge City. Myers and Rath both went with the wagons to ensure their safe delivery. Each left someone in charge of their store at the post. Jim Hanrahan stayed at the post also, to oversee his whiskey supply. As mentioned, the hunters were never told of the upcoming attack. Thus the stage was now set for one of the most famous Indian battles in the history of the West. Stay tuned.
