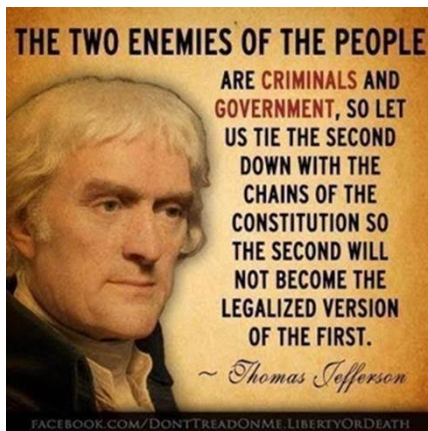

DOC SAVES WYATT EARP'S LIFE IN DODGE CITY

As you recall, Doc Holliday and Kate
left Ft. Griffin in a hurry. Kate had
set a building afire to distract
everyone so they could get away,
according to some accounts. Holliday
had been arrested and it would most
likely have resulted in serious jail
time if he waited around, so they

fled fast. Traveling on horseback at
first, they eventually got a stage to
Ft Elliott in the Panhandle of Texas
next to the town of Sweetwater. A
stage could then take them across
the Indian Territory to Camp Supply
and on to Dodge City.

While there, Kate had a miscarriage
of a little boy. Doc believed the child
was his, and felt he had lost a son.
They stayed in Sweetwater while
Kate recovered; then, in the spring of
1878, they took the stage on to Dodge
City, KS.

In Dodge, Doc once again met up with
Wyatt Earp. Brother Morgan Earp,
dime novelist Ned Buntline, and W.B.
"Bat" Masterson were also there. Dr.
Holliday opened a dental office of
sorts in Dodge. Once again, he
practiced some dentistry by day and
enjoyed his drinkin' and gamblin' in
the evenings. About that time,
brothers Jim and Virgil Earp came
through on their second trip to
California, so Doc got to meet most all
of them. Virgil Earp became a Dodge
City Policeman, and Morgan became a
deputy sheriff. Wyatt was also a
lawman.

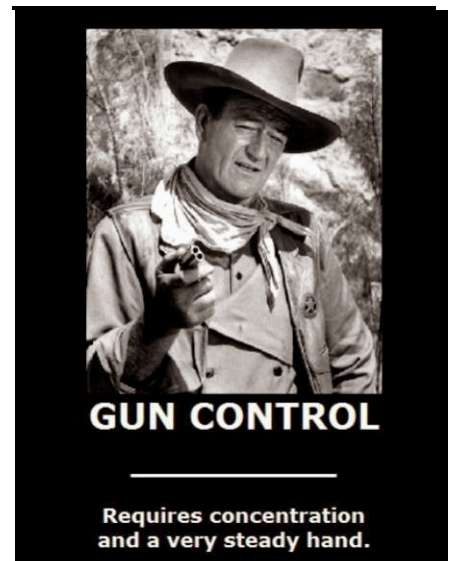
In the summer of 1878, Morgan met
and fell in love with Miss Louisa
Houston; he decided to go to Montana
with her family for a time.

In the summer of 1878, a bunch of
Indians led by Chief Dull Knife left
the reservation and killed and
massacred several outlying families.
As a result, many people on the
outskirts of Dodge came to town for
their safety. Also the army was
beefed up and large amounts of
ammunition and weapons were sent
to Ft. Dodge to be of assistance in
protection and to pursue the renegade
Indians. At the same time, herds of
cattle were coming in with cowboys
wanting to celebrate the end of the
trail. They were all well aware of the
\$1000 bounty supposedly offered by a

Texas cattle baron for the killing of
Wyatt Earp.

One such cattle man was Tobe
Driskill, who led a group of about 25
cowboys. They managed to catch
Wyatt off guard and had him dead to
rights before he could draw his guns.
Doc Holliday just so happened to be
gambling in a saloon near enough to
hear the commotion outside. He
rushed out, grabbing two pistols as
joined Wyatt on the street. Doc had
already decided Wyatt was probably
the only real friend he had, so he did
not hesitate to come to his aid. The
surprise was just enough to allow
Wyatt to draw his pistol; he quickly
"buffaloeed" one of Tobe's chief
assistants. Though outnumbered 24
to 2, Driskill (or no one else) wanted
to be the first to die. The cowboys
dispersed while Earp took several to
jail, including Driskill. Doc Holliday's
interference likely saved Wyatt
Earp's life.
