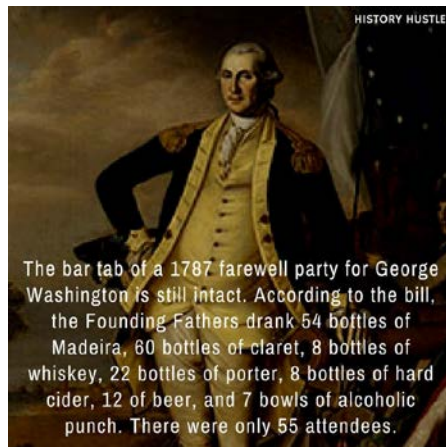

# THE WILD BUNCH CORNER

A hot time in the old town today.....of course it's hot! It's Texas and September but the WB match was just as hot! 13 competitors today. WB appears to be growing and prospering. The Texas State championship,

Wild Bunch on the Brazos is quickly approaching on Nov. 4-5. If you haven't signed up yet please do so as it really helps the powers that be in planning logistics of the match. The state match will feature 10 world class stages over two days with many interesting scenarios along with the two separate competition Bolt Action Military Matches which will have one stage as a 15 round multi position combat match and the second match will be a precision sniper match at speed. Each BAMB is its own match and you can enter one or both. A few other interesting side matches are also planned.

Now about this match we began at the fort with a 20/7/6 and immediately noticed something different. Smaller rifle targets. No, wait my mistake not smaller just moved out to an honest to gosh 25 yards. WOW what a difference in the whole feel of the stage. The wild bunch rifle actually starts having purpose when targets are pushed back 25-50 yards instead of just being a stocked axillary pistol. Moving over to the school house a couple of more good solid stages featuring bells, snuff can plate rack, statics and flippers tossing clay birds in the air and generous sized rifle targets out to 35 yards. Stepping over to Brazos Point for the last two stages one consisting of 6 rifle on swingers, 20 pistol and 5 shotgun.

The last stage was a burn it down 25 round pistol stage shooting at 5 rifle targets for distance moving to a hostage target engaging that big target twice then a static on the left back to the hostage target shooting the small flipper over to a second static and repeat for a total of 10 shots. Moving again to the area in front of the dueling trees a Nevada sweep was shot twice using a center static and left and right dueling tree for a total of 10 rounds. Everybody seemed to be shooting well today and a quick poll was taken 100% liked the rifle targets being moved out to rifle distances.

His editorship Willie Earp was in attendance shooting very well and then he sprang it on us. His silencer for his 1911 came in! We did the only logical thing, had him install it and shoot the last stage with it. Willie lays it on the table, and sez would anyone like to shoot it? Recoil is not snappy, more of a push. The sights can still be used and shooting it out around 35 yards it appeared to be just as accurate with or without the silencer. Ab-so-lutely cool!

4. All targets are bigger and closer, but...for those who like a challenge a new "Sharpshooter" category is available. They shoot the Rifle targets with pistols and Cody Dixon targets with their pistol-caliber rifle. Now there's something for everyone!

# INDIANS ON THE FRONTIER OF NORTH WEST TEXAS

History shows that the deadliest, most concentrated, and most frequent location for Indian depredations in the west was the frontier of Northwest Texas. The period of time was 1858-1874. The location was that area comprised today of Parker, Palo Pinto, and Jack Counties—as well as other counties around them to the north and west. Records show that, during this time period, 400 settlers were taken by the Indians. Several hundred horses would be run off on these raids, and dozens of settlers killed. Up until the war of Northern Aggression, the army maintained forts along a frontier line to help with protection. However, settlers maintained that when something happened, it took so long for the troops to act, that their protection was not of much value at all. Later on, Indians related they really did not have much fear of the Army. The main protection came from the frontiersmen that joined together to take action quickly. When men went off to fight in the war, they left their families unprotected.

After the war, the Federal Government did not want Rangers as such. In any event, raids continued endlessly. Settlers complained to the Texas and Federal governments, but their cries appeared to be unheard, or ignored. The government had a Quaker policy that showed the Indians mercy, understanding, and immunity while on the reservation. The Indians were given food, guns, and ammunition for their hunting excursions, even though they were

not supposed to leave the reservations in the Indian Territory.

The area of North West Texas was a Garden of Eden. There was water, wild game of all kinds, flocks of wild turkey in the thousands, antelope, deer in the tens of thousands, buffalo in endless numbers, and prairie chickens. The whole area was an oasis. And included were the settler's horses, cattle, and kidnap victims that could be sold and traded to the Comancheros from New Mexico. Along with the Quaker Indian Program, The Comanche and Kiowa had it made.

Politics that went all of the way to the US Congress were also involved. Well documented evidence proves the livestock on the ranches of New Mexico were stocked with very cheap horses and cattle purchased by the cattlemen from the Comancheros. This involved a state government that became amongst the most corrupt politicians, up into the 1880s. The politics effectively favored the Quaker Indian Policy, which in turn favored Indian raiding practices. Some of the most well known New Mexico ranchers were said to be involved in the purchase of livestock from the Comancheros.

On May 18, 1871, Gen. Wm. T. Sherman made a tour of the frontier Texas forts to evaluate the Indian problems. By the time he got to Fort Richardson, he determined that he had seen no problems—but he had heard lots of terrible stories of Indian depredations. However, while he was at the fort, survivors of the Warren Wagon Train Massacre crawled and staggered in relating what had happened hours before. Gen. Sherman's small group had passed by 150 Kiowa Indians near present day Graham, TX. The Indians let them pass. Henry Warren and his wagon train of supplies came by soon after, and were attacked by the Indians. All were massacred, except those who

escaped. One was tied to a wagon wheel and burnt alive. The realization that he and his group just narrowly escaped being annihilated caused Sherman to decide that the stories he had heard and the reports from the settlers for the past 10 years were accurate. He gave his report to the government. As head of the army out west, he changed the Indian policy to one in which he determined to solve the Indian problem once and for all. His plan was to eliminate the Indian's buffalo food source. This was already in progress due to the market for buffalo meat and hide-leather to make belts for to run the factories in the east, Midwest and Europe. Sherman also decided to use the military to search out and destroy the gathered stored food sources already in possession by the Indians. He even decided to use the Army to find and destroy the means of mobility of the Indians, by capturing and killing their horses. Whenever possible, he would kill the Indians too. These measures of eliminating their food supplies and mobility would force them to the reservations.

In this region of the Comanche-Kiowa Indian Wars, these goals were accomplished by the famous Indian Campaign known as the Red River Wars of 1874, led by the famous General Ranald S. Mackenzie. This is another story for later.

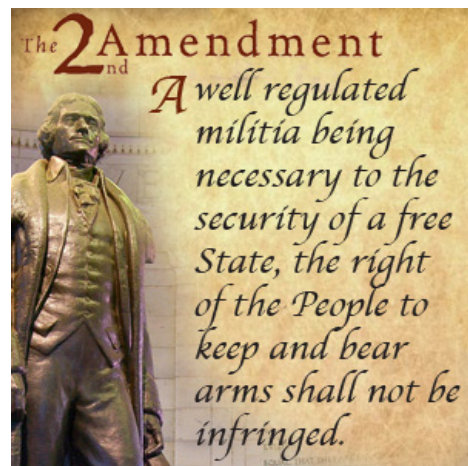
